Several plans are in the works to encourage better attendance. Julie suggested that parent need to be informed of the effect of early morning doctor's appointments. For the next meeting Lisa Robertson will be bringing the Title I numbers. Lisa shared a survey that parents will be given regarding parent conferences.
 - ii) Academic Data: Lisa reported that The Formative Loop is something that 3rd & 4th grade is doing to help math fluency. Tonya Penney reported the difficulties of using an online tool to assess young children who are just learning the tech skills. Wes Paparone shared that fewer substitutes are needed by replacing DRA with ISIP. Lisa Robertson shared info regarding the positive relationship between daily 20 minutes on ISIP and success on the STARR. She also shared data from our students this year.
 - iii) Lead 21: Administrators from Arkansas—38 administrators and pre-administrators visited our classrooms to observe and learn about blended learning and PBL.
